Our Opening Prayer

PASTOR: Almighty Father in heaven, we ask you to teach us about these last times;

CONG: As we wait and watch and work, help us to cling to your truth as we focus on Jesus, our Savior.

Bless this hour together and assure us of your loving kindness; teach us the truth about “the last days” and then, for Jesus’ sake...

...give us a glimpse of your glory and a foretaste of our home in heaven.

As we prepare our own hearts for the Last Day, hear our confession and our plea for your mercy and forgiveness:

Lord God, heavenly Father, my life is a constant struggle within. The good that I want to do, I don’t do; and the evil I wish to avoid, I keep on doing. Because of this, I am troubled with guilt and shame. When I try to justify my sin or make up for it, I find no peace or comfort. Therefore, I come to you in humility. Today’s Message from our Loving God – Revelation 7:9-17

⁹ After these things I looked, and there was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people, and language, standing in front of the throne and of the Lamb, clothed with white robes, and with palm branches in their hands. ¹⁰ They called out with a loud voice and said: Salvation comes from our God, who sits on the throne, and from the Lamb. ¹¹ All the angels stood around the throne, the elders, and the four living creatures. They fell on their faces before the throne and worshipped God, ¹² saying: Amen. Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanks and honor and power and might belong to our God forever and ever. Amen. ¹³ One of the elders spoke to me and said, “These people dressed in white robes, who are they and where did they come from?” And I answered him, “Sir, you know.”

¹⁴ And he said to me: These are the ones who are coming out of the great tribulation. They have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb.

¹⁵ Because of this they are in front of the throne of God, and they serve him day and night in his temple. He who sits on the throne will spread his tent over them. ¹⁶ They will never be hungry or thirsty ever again. The sun will never beat upon them, nor will any scorching heat, ¹⁷ for the Lamb at the center of the throne will be their shepherd. He will lead them to springs of living water. And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes.

The Lord’s Supper

PASTOR: It is always good to give thanks to you, Heavenly Father, for Jesus our Savior and all other blessings. In grace, you will preserve your Church to until the Last Day when you will gather all your people and take us into glory. Therefore, with all the

SAINTS on earth and hosts of heaven, we praise your holy name and join their glorious song:

(Sanctus – Is. 6:3; Mt. 21:9)

(sung) **O holy, holy, holy – Lord God of pow’r and might,** *(tune: CW 855)*
Your glory, earth and heaven, in countless ways recite.
Hosanna! Come and save us, Lord God of hosts on high,
And in your grace and mercy – receive our fervent cry.

Jesus Words instituting his supper: Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night he was betrayed, took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying, “Take and eat; this is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.” Then he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, “Drink from it, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is poured out for you for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me.”

O Christ, Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world – *(Agnus Dei – Jn. 1:29)*

Have mercy on us and grant us your peace. Amen!

God’s Word speaks of the spiritual blessings of this Sacrament (Mt. 26:28) and warns against the spiritual danger of being unprepared for this holy meal (1 Cor. 11:27-29). Because we deeply care about you and don’t want to see anyone’s faith harmed, we ask that if you have not studied with us or spoken with our pastor first, that you refrain from joining in the Sacrament today. We are not judging your love for Jesus but rather displaying loving caution for all involved. Please feel free to ask our pastor if you have questions. We are eager to listen and share over an open Bible.
