With God's help and blessing, we will:

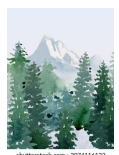
- Provide a quality, Christ-centered, educational program which will equip our students with the skills they need to be knowledgeable learners, successful workers, and productive citizens.

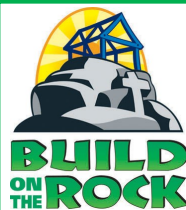

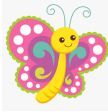

## Grade 3

This week has been a letter writing week. Your child should have, or will soon be receiving a letter that they addressed the envelope for. We received pen pal letters from the students at King of Kings in Maitland, FL. They are included in Friday folders. We answered their questions and mailed them back. We also learned the difference between friendly letters and business letters. We sent business letters to our favorite businesses. If they reply, I will make sure that students receive any correspondence that we receive at school after summer break begins.

In Math, we multiplied single digits, by 4-digit numbers, learned about geometric solids (faces, vertexes, and edges), and functions. In Reading, we started the outlines for our Animal Reports.
